

Dr. Frederic B. Dutton



On October 20, 1966, the MSU Board of Trustees created the Planning Committee for Lyman Briggs College, appointing

Dr. Frederic Dutton—then Director of the Science and Mathematics Teaching Center—as its chair. Dr. Dutton led the committee in creating a common agreement on a residential college for students seeking a liberal education in the physical and biological sciences; students seeking pre-professional training and students seeking one of the majors currently offered in the College of Natural Science, but in the context of a small liberal arts and science college. Dr. Dutton recruited many of the pioneering faculty who would create the new curriculum. On July 1, 1967, Lyman Briggs College opened with Dr. Dutton serving as its first Dean. Upon his retirement in 1973, then MSU President Clifton Wharton established the Frederic B. Dutton Award for students demonstrating scholarship and leadership that contributed to the development of the College. Dr. Dutton died in 1995. Dr. Dutton will be remembered for making a difference in undergraduate education by creating the BEST OF BOTH WORLDS!

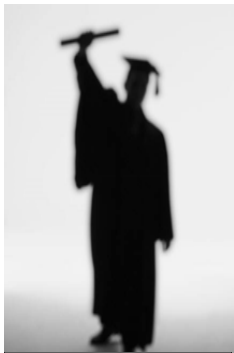

recruiting the 'Best and the Brightest', scholarships are important.

The recent return of college status means that Briggs students lost access to the scholarships previously available through the College of Natural Science.

This has created a challenge for Briggs and a corresponding opportunity for Briggsies to do 'Something BIG for Briggs' by supporting the first of a series of endowed scholarships honoring our pioneering faculty and staff.

While all gifts to Michigan State University contribute to the high quality of education, research, and outreach, endowments are particularly meaningful as they offer a dependable, perpetual source of funding.

How the Endowment Works

This scholarship fund creates an endowment with a goal of \$100,000. **The income from this endowment funds a perpetual scholarship award of \$5,000 per year** (depending on rate of return). Individual gifts will become a part of the endowment at the following levels:

Bronze Ambassador	\$2,500
Silver Ambassador	\$5,000
Gold Ambassador	\$7,500
Platinum Ambassador	\$10,000

Gifts can be paid over a 5-year period. Scholarship awards will begin when the endowment reaches a minimum funding of \$30,000 and will increase as the endowment becomes fully funded. A plaque recognizing donors will be placed in the College. Donors will also receive a yearly correspondence from scholarship recipients.

Awarding the Scholarship

The Dutton Scholarship will be awarded annually to one or more recipients. The amount of the award shall be determined by the Dean of Lyman Briggs and the amount of distributable income available.

Recipients shall be selected according to the following criteria:

- Academically talented students with preference given to incoming freshmen
- Enrolled in Lyman Briggs College
- Financial need may be considered
- Awards may reflect the recruiting needs of the College
- Scholarships may be renewable as determined by the College
